

(8) Kozomi Beach

This beach of fine white sand stretches along the shore of a shallow cove, where you can hear the sand shifting with each step. This beach is popular with surfers, and competitions are held here



9 Kitano Shrine Lantern

his goshinto (sacred antern) was crafted by Kawaroku, a stonemasor active at the end of the Edo period (1603-1868), using Aoya stone quarried in Aoya, Tottori City. The unique design features a small quardian dog on top of the lantern.



This shrine is dedicated to Sugawara-no-Michizane the god of learning.

2) Hakuto Shrine

A shrine dedicated to the white hare of legend, Shiro'usagi-no-Kami. This hare is the god of matchmaking, and the shrine is a popular sacred site said to have healing effects.

This is a sacred pond where the mythical white hare is said to have washed his wounds and healed himself by applying cattails to his wounds. Because the water level is constant regardless of the season, it is also called "the unchanging pond."




(5) Okinoshima Island

This island is the setting of the myth of the Hare of Inaba.

The southern side of the island is made up of a series

of rocks in the shape of stepping stones, which can be likened to the backs of the sharks that appear in the myth.



beaches. In addition to being crowded with bathers, nearby there is a colony of Japanese roses, a national natural treasure. Because it is the setting of a famous myth of love, the area has been designated as a "Lovers' Sanctuary" where lovers gather. It is also popular as a spot to watch the sun set.



(2) Mikuma Shrine

This single shrine pavilion stands at the end of a steep slope up a mountain path. Behind it is a rare geological phenomenon of columnar basalt piled up on its side, which has been designated as a cultural asset by Tottori City.



(3) Tsuzurao Castle Ruins

The ruins of Tsuzurao Castle, said to have been built by Yoshioka Sadakatsu, a powerful provincial official in Inaba Province.



(4) Stone Piles

Stones piled up at the bottom of the lake to provide passage for crucian carp. "Ishigama fishing" at Lake Kovama-ike is a nationally rare fishing method using stone piles, which was practiced as a side job by farmers in the Edo period. There used to be nearly 80 stone piles at one time, but now there are only four.



5) Mitsu Shrine

Here there is a night lantern by Kawaroku, a stonemason active at the end of the Edo period (1603–1868). The design features an adorable guardian dog carrying the heavy lantern on its back.

The Kannon pilgrimage route was established so that pilgrims could make the journey from Kii (Wakayama) to various sacred sites in the western part of Japan, including Kansai, Chugoku, and Mino (Gifu), all in the area of Mt. Akiba. Akiba Daigongen, the god of fire protection, is enshrined on the hillside. It takes about 45 minutes to walk around the mountain.

(12) Tottori Deai no Mori Park

With various walking trails and lawn areas, visitors can enjoy interacting with the forest in the midst of nature from season to season

(10) Aoshima Island

The largest island in Lake Koyama-ike, It is known as a cherry blossom viewing spot. From the observation deck at the top at the top of the mountain you can see the Koyama dunes and the Sea of Japan. The island can be circled and is popular as a hiking course. Lake Koyama-ike Information Plaza is the heart of San'in Kaigan Geopark, where visitors can learn about Lake Koyama-ike through panel displays and various hands-on activities.



(11) Nekojima (Cat Island)

A branch shrine of Benten-gu Shrine on Chikubujima Island in Lake Biwa. The legends of Koyama no Nekoyakushi (The Cat Healer of Koyamaike) and Nekojima Ibun (The Strange Tale of Cat Island) have been handed down among the
